Internet Safety Guidelines



NO PERSONAL INFORMATION!

I will tell my parents right away if I feel something uncomfortable.

NO PRIVATE MEETINGS!

I will never agree to meet with someone I have chatted with

online.



NO SHARING!



I will never send a stranger my picture or anything else.



SHOCK YALUE!



I will not answer to any messages that are mean or make me feel uncomfortable. I will tell my parents right away so that they can help me.



PROTECT MY PASSWORD!

I will not give out my Internet password to anyone (even my best friends) other than my parents.



POWNLOAD CHECK!

I will check with my parents before downloading or installing any software. This might hurt our computer. I will not click on "popup" advertising.



WISE CITIZENSHIP!

I will be a good online citizen and not do anything that hurts other people or is against the law.

- The time of day that I can be online.
- -The length of time I can be online.
- -Appropriate areas for me to visit.
- I will not access other areas or break these rules without their permission.




